WHEREAS, C.O. Wolfe, Anderson, S.C., and R.A. Jolley, of Greenville, S.C.

did on the 4th day of May, 1925, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is Piedmont Chero Cola Bottling Company

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S.C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is

to manufacture and sell either wholesale or retail, syrups, soft drinks of all kind, especially Chero Cola, to deal in all forms of stocks, bonds, mortgages and notes, and other forms of indebtedness, to buy, sell, own and deal in real estate, and to do any and all other things necessary or incidental to the aforesaid business. To own and operate other plants for the bottling of syrups, soft drinks, etc. and for the sale of any and all products produced by said plant or plants.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Twenty-five thousand (\$25,000.00)

payable in cash, merchandise or personal property as the directors may call for.

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is two hundred fifty (250) of the par value of One hundred (\$100.00) Dollars

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 20th day of April, 1925, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy, the following were elected directors: R.A. Jolley and C.O. Wolfe

EIGHT: That subsequently there was elected as President C.O. Wolfe as Vice-President, R.A. Jolley as Secretary, R.A. Jolley as Treasurer,

NINTH: That all requirements of Chapter XXXXX I, Article 1, of the Civil Code of South Carolina, 1922 and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent. of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in Greenville News a newspaper published in the County of Greenville NOW, THEREFORE, I, W.P. Blackwell, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.

did on the 27th day of May, 1925, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is J. Archie Willis & Company

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S.C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is to buy, own, develop, improve,

mortgage, sell and otherwise deal in real estate; to deal in stocks, bonds, mortgages, notes and other forms of indebtedness; to own, maintain and operate a daily and Sunday Newspaper in the City of Greenville, S.C.; to erect, construct and build all forms of houses and structures, and the further right to do a general contracting business, such as the erection of houses, buildings, power lines, laying of cement and concrete or other forms of paving; to do any and all other things necessary or incidental to the aforesaid business.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Fifty thousand (\$50,000.00)

payable in cash or personal property at the call of the directors.

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is five hundred (500) of the par value of One hundred (\$100.00) Dollars

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 26th day of May, 1925, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy, the following were elected directors: J. Archie Willis, John W. Lipscomb, S.L. McRee, R.O. Hunt

EIGHT: That subsequently there was elected as President J. Archie Willis as Vice-President, S.L. McRee, John W. Lipscomb, as Secretary, R.O. Hunt as Treasurer, J. Archie Willis

NINTH: That all requirements of Chapter XXXX I, Article 1, of the Civil Code of South Carolina, 1922 and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent. of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in Greenville Daily a newspaper published in the County of Greenville NOW, THEREFORE, I, W.P. Blackwell, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
