WHEREAS, A. J. Day of Greenville, S. C. and R. B. Smith of Greenville, S. C.

did on the 1st day of October, 1925, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is Cregan Lumber Company

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is to deal in lumber
business, supplies for wholesale and retail, buy, own
develop, improve, mortgages, sell and otherwise deal
in real estate, to deal in stocks, bonds, mortgages,
contracts and other forms of indebtedness, to erect
structures and the various rights to do so,
and all other business, such as the erection

at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy, the following were elected directors:
A. J. Day, J. P. McBurn and R. B. Smith

EIGHT: That subsequently there was elected as President A. J. Day
as Vice-President W. A. Mc, as Secretary, W. A. Mc, as Treasurer, J. P. McBurn

NINTH: That all requirements of Chapter XLVII, 1 Article 1, of the Civil Code of South Carolina, 1912, 1922
and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent. of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona
fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration
with the Secretary of State having been given in Greenville Daily News

NOW, THEREFORE, I, W. P. Blackwell, Secretary of State, by virtue of the
authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the
laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under
their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court
