lying and being in the City of Greenville, County of Greenville, and having the following metes and bounds, according to plat now recorded in the R.A.C. Office for Greenville County in Plat Book "A" at page 353, to-wit: Beginning at a stake on Laurens Road, at the corner of lots 50 and 59 Block "D" in East Park, Boyce's Addition to Greenville and running thence along Laurens Road N. 68-30 W. 50 feet to a stake at the corner of Laurens and Washington Roads; thence along Washington Road S. 83-30 W. 186 feet; thence in a straight line in a southeasterly direction, and in straight line with the line between lots 60 and 61, 88 feet, more or less, to a stake, at the joint corner of lots 61 and 60; thence with the line of lots 60 and 59, N. 48-15 E. 188-1/2 feet to the beginning corner, and being a part of lot No. 59 situated on the southwest corner of Washington & Laurens Roads, fronting said Laurens Road 60 feet, and being a part of one of the lots conveyed to Walter West by Arthur S. Office for Greenville County, S.C., in Plat Book "A", at page 353, to-wit: Lot #50 of Block "D" Southeast corner, Laurens Road and Sixth Avenue, fronting Laurens Road 72 feet; this being one of the lots conveyed to W.B. Harrison by deed dated October 6th, 1911, and recorded in Vol. 7, at page 343, R.A.C. Office for Greenville County. This conveyance is subject to same restrictions as above stated.

TOGETHER with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances whatsoever to the said premises belonging, or in anywise appertaining, and the reversions and the remainders, rents, issues and profits thereof; and also all the estate, right, title, interest, dower, possession, property, benefit, claim and demand whatsoever, both at law and in equity, of the said Wm Perry Harrison deceased

and of all the parties to the said suit, and of all other persons rightfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof, by, from or under them, or either of them.
