And, whereas, Broad River Power Company has made an offer in writing to purchase said 44,000 volt electric line and rights of way running from Fair Forest to the sub-station located in Spartanburg and Greenville Counties, together with the complete outdoor sub-station equipment, including transformers, lightning arresters, disconnecting switches, and other equipment pertaining to this sub-station for the sum of twenty-six thousand five hundred (\$26,500.00) dollars, with the promise that it be given the first chance to purchase the local distribution lines and equipment in case the city should decide at any time to sell this also:-

And, whereas, in the judgment of the city Council of Greer, the sale of this power line to Broad River Power Company would be of material benefit to the city:-

Resolved, that the city Council of Greer does hereby approve of said sale, upon the terms and conditions hereinafter specified:-

Resolved, further, that the city Council of Greer, in consideration of Broad River Power Company paying the sum of twenty-six thousand five hundred (\$26,500.00) dollars for its power line running from Fair Forest to the city of Greer, does hereby promise, agree and covenant to give Broad River Power Company the first chance to purchase its local distribution lines and equipment in case the city should decide at any time to sell the same.

Done and ratified in accordance with the provisions of Act No. 317 of the Thirty-second volume of the Statutes at Large of South Carolina, 1921, this 15th day of February 1927.
