 Furniture Exchange, Greenville, S.C. Bankrupt.
 It appearing from the record in this case and the
 verified petition of J. M. Thell, Trustee for the above
 named estate, that the assets of the Bankrupt included
 the real estate hereinafter described. This property was
 covered by a real estate mortgage in the amount
 of six thousand (\$6,000.00) dollars, with additional
 accrued interest, attorneys fees and taxes, which
 mortgage has been offered in the Bankruptcy
 Court as a secured claim and the Court has allowed
 the claim. On January 22, 1927, the Referee in
 Bankruptcy passed an order authorizing the Trustee
 to advertise this real estate for sale and offer
 it at public auction on Monday March 7, 1927,
 a legal sales day. The mortgagee H. H. Laboon,
 consenting to this procedure and endorsed his
 consent on the original order. It also appears
 from the record that the mortgagee agreed
 in case his bid should be successful, to pay
 all costs and expenses incident to the sale
 as well as all taxes, and to credit the
 balance of his bid upon the mortgage debt.

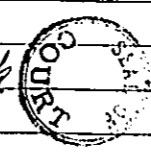
The report of the Trustee shows that a sale was
 duly held at Greenville County Court house at
 the time and on the terms set forth in the
 order of the referee. At the sale there was some
 competing bidding and the mortgagee H. H. Laboon,
 was the highest bidder, his successful bid
 being for the sum of Five Thousand (\$5,000.00)
 dollars, now, on motion of the Trustee, it is ordered
 and adjudged that the said sale of the real estate
 hereinafter described to H. H. Laboon for the sum of
 Five Thousand (\$5,000.00) dollars be, and it is hereby
 confirmed, and that upon compliance by the said
 H. H. Laboon with the terms of sale as provided in the
 order signed by the referee, dated January 22, 1927,
 that the said J. M. Thell, as Trustee for the above
 estate, do make and deliver to the said H. H. Laboon
 a deed conveying the title to the said land. The
 real estate affected by this order is described as
 follows; All that certain piece, parcel or lot of
 land situate on the northwest corner of Maskley
 and Rhett Streets and having the following metes
 and bounds, beginning at said corner of Rhett
 and Maskley Streets and thence running with Maskley
 Street N. 20 1/2 feet to a stake; thence S. 70 1/2 feet
 to a stake; thence S. 21 1/2 feet to a stake; thence
 N. 67 1/2 feet to the beginning corner, and being
 the same lot of land conveyed unto J. D. Bridges
 by H. H. Laboon on May 26, 1926, by deed recorded
 in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County, in
 Volume 97 at page 162.
