The undersigned, hereby acknowledge, have Granted, Bargained, Sold and Released, and by these presents do Grant, Bargain, Sell and Release unto the said J. Earle Freeman, all that piece of land or tract of land in tract and more commonly Greenville, being State of South Carolina, and in that tract of land bounded by lands of S. G. James and his wife, and the tract now of J. Earle Freeman, G. E. McElroy, being a tract of land in tract of land of S. G. James and G. E. McElroy, formerly held under my authority above, given to me by another Russell, but clear and quiet title to the right and claim made to me by said Russell, and another Russell during year 1925 and having the following lines and boundaries:

Beginning on iron rail on east bank of Enoree River at its confluence with the S. G. E. McElroy's chain to iron rail near plantation house, thence S. E. 35° 17' chain to iron rail on west side of plantation road, thence S. E. 35° 17' chain to iron rail on side of road, thence N. 25° 45' W. 35° 17' chain to small regular iron rail, thence down marsh with meanders S. 56° 17' chain to point on branch at the tip of the bend, thence S. 56° 17' chain to point on Enoree River, thence with meanders of said river to beginning corner and containing seventeen and twenty-five hundredths (17.75) acres more or less according to survey made for division by J. Earle Freeman.
