to it in hand duly paid at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents by the grantee hereinafter named (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged) has granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents does grant, bargain, sell and release unto E. P. Brown

All its interest in Lot No. 589, in Section 2 of Graceland Cemetery subject, however, to the same rules, regulations and conditions contained in the original deed to Mrs. L. B. Brown.

TOGETHER with, all and singular, the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in anywise incident or appertaining TO HAVE AND TO HOLD, all and singular, the premises before mentioned unto the grantee hereinafter named, and his heirs and assigns forever.

And the said granting corporation does hereby bind itself and its successors to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the grantee hereinafter named, and his heirs and assigns, against itself and its successors, and against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof.

In witness whereof the said granting corporation has caused its corporate seal to be hereunto affixed and these presents to be subscribed by its duly authorized officers on this the 24th day of February, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and thirty, and in the one hundred and fifty year of the Sovereignty and Independence of the United States of America.
