did on the 20th day of April, 1927, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is Fluco Laboratories Inc.

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is:

EIGHT: That subsequently there was elected as President W. C. Cleveland as Vice-President, A. G. Walker, as Secretary, Roy H. Bogeman as Treasurer, Roy H. Bogeman

NINTH: That all requirements of Chapter 24, Article I, of the Civil Code of South Carolina, 1922, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent. of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in Greenville Daily News newspaper published in the County of Greenville
