WHEREAS, W. F. Mauldin, Fountain Inn, S. C., J. R. Mauldin, Pine Top, N. C., and C. A. Parsons, Fountain Inn, S. C.

did on the 15 day of March, 1928, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is W. F. Mauldin

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Fountain Inn, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is to buy and sell automobiles; trucks; tractors; automobile parts; accessories; fertilizers; gasoline; oil; to maintain and operate a general repair shop and to do any and all things incident to the carrying on of an automobile business.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Five Thousand (\$5,000.00) Dollars,

payable in cash or the equivalent thereof

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is Fifty (50) of the par value of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 12th day of March, 1928, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy, the following were elected directors:

W. F. Mauldin, J. R. Mauldin and C. A. Parsons.

EIGHT: That subsequently there was elected as President W. F. Mauldin, as Vice-President J. R. Mauldin, as Secretary C. A. Parsons, as Treasurer C. A. Parsons.

NINTH: That all requirements of Chapter XXVII, L Article I, of the Civil Code of South Carolina, 1922, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent. of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in Fountain Inn Tribune a newspaper published in the County of Greenville.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, W. P. Blackwell, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
