WHEREAS, H. J. Haynsworth and A. S. Hark, both of Greenville, S.C.

did on the 1st day of June, 1928, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is The Greenville Title Guar- antee Company

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S.C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is to act as agent for any and for all persons or corporations writing insurance of any kind in South Carolina; to buy, own, develop, improve, mortgage, sell and otherwise deal in real estate; deal in stocks, bonds, mortgages, notes and every other form of indebtedness; to own, maintain and operate an abstract company for the purpose of furnishing abstracts of titles to real estate; for the purpose of furnishing legal opinions as to the validity of titles to real and personal property of whatever kind; to act as executor, administrator and trustee; and to engage in any other form of business for gain with the right and privilege to maintain office anywhere within the State of South Carolina for the convenience of said business.

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is twenty (20) of the par value of Fifty (50) Dollars

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 5th day of May, 1928, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy, the following were elected directors:

EIGHT: That subsequently there was elected as President C. W. Fillingim as Vice-President, L. S. Houston; as Secretary, L. S. Houston as Treasurer, L. S. Houston

NINTH: That all requirements of Chapter 21-113, Article I, of the Civil Code of South Carolina, 1922, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent. of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in The Greenville News a newspaper published in the County of Greenville

NOW, THEREFORE, I, H. P. Blackwell, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Meane Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
