WHEREAS, John T. Woodside, Greenville, S.C., J.D. Woodside, New York City, E.F. Woodside, Greenville, S.C., Robt. I. Woodside, Greenville, S.C., Oliver Isalin, New York City and J.B. Ricketts, Greenville, S.C.

did on the 5th day of June, 1928, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is Myrtle Beach Estate, Incorporated

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S.C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is To buy, own, hold, develop, subdivide, lease, mortgage, and (or) sell real estate; to borrow money; to lend money, also to do a general brokerage business; to make, issue, buy and sell notes, stocks, bonds, securities and (or) guarantee payment of the same; to buy, sell and deal in personal property and real estate; to deal in and (or) dispose of, or operate manufacturing plants, factories, shops, mills or other concerns of like nature; to buy, own, operate, construct, lease and (or) sell power lines and power plants for the purpose of producing, developing and transmitting electric power and current and the right to use and (or) sell such power and current for domestic, commercial and industrial uses; the right to build houses, to erect buildings for any purpose whatsoever; to engage in any line of business for the purpose of dealing in lands as owner or sales agent, lessee or lessor; to build, own, lease, and (or) operate hotels, places of amusement, restaurants, cafeterias; to build, own, and (or) operate parks, piers, boats, yachts and other pleasure craft; to establish, own and operate social clubs and other like organizations; to own, establish, buy, sell, lease and (or) operate radio broadcasting stations to engage in mercantile business, either wholesale or retail or both, to engage in farming; to build, own, sell, lease and (or) operate telephone lines, circuits, centrals and switchboards; to buy, own, construct, sell pipe lines, tanks, reservoirs and all other things incidental or necessary to the operation of a general waterworks system, including the producing, furnishing and supplying such water, with the right to sell the same for domestic, commercial and industrial and other uses; To buy, sell, hold, own, vote and deal in stocks of other corporations. To build, construct, buy, own, operate and maintain a sewer system and to charge for the use of the same. Together with the full right, privilege and authority to do and perform any and all things which may be necessary or in anywise incident to the exercise and use of the rights, privileges and powers hereinabove set forth; also to do all other acts and things not forbidden to business corporations under the laws of the State of South Carolina.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Six Million (\$6,000,000.00)

payable in property and money

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is Sixty Thousand (60,000)

of the par value of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 31st day of May, 1928,

at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy, the following were elected directors: John T. Woodside, J.D. Woodside, Robt. I. Woodside and E.F. Woodside

EIGHT: That subsequently there was elected as President John T. Woodside

as Vice-President, J.D. Woodside, R.I. Woodside, as Secretary, J.B. Ricketts as Treasurer,

NINTH: That all requirements of Chapter 26, Article I, of the Civil Code of South Carolina, 1912, 1922 and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent. of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in Greenville News a newspaper published in the County of Greenville

NOW, THEREFORE, I, W.P. Blackwell, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
