WHEREAS, Alfred T. Smith and Frank M. Ashmore, both of Greenville, S.C.

did on the 30th day of July, 1928, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

- FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.
SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is Smith & Ashmore, Inc.
THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S.C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is maintain and operate a general retail clothing and furnishing store

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Ten Thousand (\$10,000.00) Dollars, payable in cash or its equivalent

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is One hundred (100) of the par value of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 28th day of July, 1928, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy, the following were elected directors: Alfred T. Smith and Frank M. Ashmore

EIGHT: That subsequently there was elected as President Alfred T. Smith, as Vice-President Alfred T. Smith, as Secretary Frank M. Ashmore, as Treasurer Alfred T. Smith

NINTH: That all requirements of Chapter 21, Article 1, of the Civil Code of South Carolina, 1922, 1923, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent. of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in The Furman newspaper published in the County of Greenville

NOW, THEREFORE, I, W. P. Blackwell, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Meane Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.

WHEREAS, Isidore Kayser of Selma, Ala., and Edwin A. Long, of Greenville, S.C.

did on the 7th day of August, 1928, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

- FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.
SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is Kayser & Long, Incorporated
THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S.C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is Buying and selling goods, wares and merchandise, and especially without in any way limiting their powers, to engage in the sale of ladies ready to wares, and generally exercising all powers conferred by law on business corporations.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Twenty five Thousand (\$25,000.00) Dollars, payable On or before Sept. 1st, 1928

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is Two Hundred Fifty (250) of the par value of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 27th day of July, 1928, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy, the following were elected directors: Isidore Kayser, Edwin A. Long and Edwin B. Kayser

EIGHT: That subsequently there was elected as President Isidore Kayser, as Vice-President Edwin A. Long, as Secretary Edwin B. Kayser, as Treasurer Edwin A. Long

NINTH: That all requirements of Chapter 22, Article 1, of the Civil Code of South Carolina, 1922, 1923, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent. of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in Greenville Piedmont newspaper published in the County of Greenville

NOW, THEREFORE, I, W. P. Blackwell, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Meane Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
