WHEREAS, E. H. Bussey and W. H. Aiken both of Greenville, S. C.

did on the 2nd day of August, 1928, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

- FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.
SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is J. L. Bussey & Company, Inc.
THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S.C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is to buy and sell cotton and other agricultural products, as merchants, factors and brokers, on commission or otherwise; to buy and sell all kinds of exchange promissory notes, and other negotiable instruments, and real estate; to do a general warehousing business for cotton and other agricultural products; to establish branches in other and other states and to do such other business in connection with a general cotton and commission business as may be necessary and legitimate together with all the powers conferred upon corporations under the general laws of this State.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Twenty-five Thousand (\$25,000.00) Dollars,

payable at once in money or in property

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is two hundred and fifty (250) of the par value of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars each

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 1st day of August, 1928, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy, the following were elected directors: E. H. Bussey, W. H. Aiken, and J. L. Stull

EIGHT: That subsequently there was elected as President E. H. Bussey, as Vice-President J. L. Stull, as Secretary W. H. Aiken, as Treasurer E. H. Bussey

NINTH: That all requirements of Chapter 24-1, Article I, of the Civil Code of South Carolina, 1922, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent. of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in Greenville News newspaper published in the County of Greenville

NOW, THEREFORE, I, H. P. Blackwell, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Means Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
