EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT.

WHEREAS, W. A. Garrison and Lee M. Mory, both of Greenville, S.C.

did on the 21st day of December, 1926, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is Garrison Realty Company

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S.C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is to buy, sell, handle, develop and deal in real estate, with power to mortgage or encumber any lands held by the Corporation and which the further power to buy, sell and deal in used automobiles, together with all of the general powers conferred upon corporations under the laws of the State of South Carolina.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Two thousand (\$2,000.00) Dollars,

EIGHT: That subsequently there was elected as President W. A. Garrison as Vice-President, Lee M. Mory as Secretary, Lee M. Mory as Treasurer, W. A. Garrison

NINTH: That all requirements of Chapter 2235, Article I, of the Civil Code of South Carolina, 1922, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent. of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in The Daily Piedmont newspaper published in the County of Greenville

NOW, THEREFORE, I, W. P. Blackwell, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Meane Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.

WHEREAS, Edward S. Macomber, Henry S. Newcombe of Providence, R.I., and Frank J. Riordan, of Greenville, S.C.

did on the 27th day of December, 1928, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is E. S. Macomber & Company (Incorporated)

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S.C.

Macomber, H. S. Newcombe, Frank J. Riordan, Lester J. Boyd and H. Robert Hadden

EIGHT: That subsequently there was elected as President Edward S. Macomber; as Vice-President, Henry S. Newcombe, as Secretary, and Asst. Treas. H. Robert Hadden as Treasurer, Lester J. Boyd, as Vice President and Manager; Frank J. Riordan.

NINTH: That all requirements of Chapter 2235, Article I, of the Civil Code of South Carolina, 1922, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent. of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in The Greenville Piedmont newspaper published in the County of Greenville
