EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT.

WHEREAS, G. F. Norris and C. B. Morgan, both of Greenville, S. C.

did on the 2nd day of January, 1929, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

- FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.
SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is Greenville Textile Company
THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is buying, selling, dealing in, bleaching and finishing of millings, dyeing, weaving, and making of fabrics, and all other work, and holding, buying, selling and dealing in stocks and securities of other corporations.

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 31st day of January, 1929, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy, the following were elected directors: G. F. Norris, C. B. Morgan, G. F. Norris and C. B. Morgan.

EIGHT: That subsequently there was elected as President G. F. Norris as Vice-President, J. M. Norris; as Secretary, C. B. Morgan as Treasurer, G. F. Norris.

NINTH: That all requirements of Chapter 2204, Article I, of the Civil Code of South Carolina, 1922, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent. of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in Greenville Daily News newspaper published in the County of Greenville.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, J. P. Blackwell, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Meane Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.

WHEREAS, A. H. Taylor and Chas. Dushan, both of Greenville S. C.

did on the 23rd day of November, 1928, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

- FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.
SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is Taylor Dushan, Inc.
THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is Buy, sell and exchange radio outfits, to repair same, and to sell all parts, appliances and fixtures used in connection therewith.
