EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT.

WHEREAS, Alex Kirsiakides and James Tzouzelekas

did on the 22nd day of April, 1929, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is Princess Cafe

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S.C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is:

Own cafe, or cafes, solely or as partner with others, or by purchase and ownership of stock in other cafes incorporated, or to purchase, own and hold stock in corporations owning one or more cafes; to operate cafes generally by ownership or through leases from owners, to buy, own, and sell real estate, either in fee simple title or leasehold interest and to sublet, or sub-lease to others such interest, and to own, in like manner hotel, rooming house and to buy, own, and sell stock in corporations incident to such business.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Six Thousand (\$6,000.00) Dollars,

payable in cash or personal property

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is Sixty (60) of the par value of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars.

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 20th day of April, 1929,

at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy, the following were elected directors: Alex Kirsiakides, James Tzouzelekas, and Mrs Mary Kirsiakides

EIGHT: That subsequently there was elected as President Alex Kirsiakides,

as Vice-President, James Tzouzelekas as Secretary, James Tzouzelekas as Treasurer,

NINTH: That all requirements of Chapter 42-43, Article I, of the Civil Code of South Carolina, 1942, 1922, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent. of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in the Greenville Advertiser newspaper published in the County of Greenville.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, W.P. Blackwell, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Meane Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
