WHEREAS, W. A. Brown and W. L. Brown, both of Greenville, S.C.

did on the 6th day of May, 1929, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is Brown Bros. Drayage Co.

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S.C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is

to engage in the business of transfer for hire of baggage and freight; to do a general hauling and transport business; to purchase, Automobiles, trucks and horses and use to carry on the business, and to rent the same for hire; to operate and maintain one or more warehouses and store rooms and to store and care for all kinds of vehicles and personal property of every description; to do a general storage business for hire.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Five Thousand (\$5,000.00) Dollars,

payable in Cash

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is Fifty (50) of the par value of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 2nd day of May, 1929, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy, the following were elected directors:

W. A. Brown and W. L. Brown

EIGHT: That subsequently there was elected as President W. A. Brown as Vice-President, W. L. Brown as Secretary, W. A. Brown as Treasurer,

NINTH: That all requirements of Chapter XXVII, Article I, of the Civil Code of South Carolina, 1922, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent. of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in Greenville News, a newspaper published in the County of Greenville.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, W. P. Blackwell, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.

WHEREAS, R. R. Bishop and E. J. Bishop, both of Greenville, S.C.

did on the 14th day of May, 1929, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is Hillhouse - Bishop Tire Co.

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S.C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is

To sell or trade both wholesale and retail automobile tires, tubes, accessories, batteries, and to do general repair business including batteries and vulcanizing of tires; to sell or trade automobiles or automobile parts.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Fifteen Thousand (\$15,000.00) Dollars,

payable in money or in property; \$10,000.00 having been subscribed and paid for in full and the balance to be sold and paid for upon the call of the directors.

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 13th day of May, 1929, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy, the following were elected directors:

EIGHT: That subsequently there was elected as President R. R. Bishop as Vice-President, E. J. Bishop as Secretary, R. R. Bishop as Treasurer,

NINTH: That all requirements of Chapter XXVII, Article I, of the Civil Code of South Carolina, 1922, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent. of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in Greenville News, a newspaper published in the County of Greenville.
