WHEREAS, Eugene Bryant and J. D. Poteat, both of Greenville, S.C.

did on the 15th day of May, 1929, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is Fidelity Company, Inc.

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S.C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is:

To buy, own, sell and trade in real estate, stocks, notes, bonds and investments and securities of every description; to act as agent or broker in the transfer or sale of any of such property investment or securities; to lend money upon real estate and securities of all kinds. Fully generally to transact all business as may be permitted under the existing law, or which may hereafter be conferred upon such corporations by law.

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 14th day of May, 1929, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy, the following were elected directors:

Alexander G. Furman, Alexander G. Furman, Jr., R. M. Hudgens and Broadus Bailey

EIGHT: That subsequently there was elected as President R. M. Hudgens as Vice-President, Broadus Bailey, as Secretary, Alexander G. Furman, Jr. as Treasurer, Alexander G. Furman, Jr.

NINTH: That all requirements of Chapter XXV, Article I, of the Civil Code of South Carolina, 1922 and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent. of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in Greenville News a newspaper published in the County of Greenville

NOW, THEREFORE, I, W. P. Blackwell, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
