- FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.
SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is Meridick Investment Corporation
THIRD: That the principal place of business is Grunville, S. C.

NINTH: That all requirements of Chapter 2224, Article I, of the Civil Code of South Carolina, 1922, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent. of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in Grunville, a newspaper published in the County of Grunville.
