WHEREAS, W. C. Cleveland and T. A. Snyder, both of Greenville, S. C.

did on the 22nd day of April, 1923, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is Little River Land Company.
