

THE STATE OF SOUTH CAROLINA, BY THE SECRETARY OF THE STATE.

EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT.

WHEREAS, H. C. Beattie and A. C. Varner, both of Greenville, S. C.

did on the 5th day of May, 1930, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is Varner Auto Storage Company

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is operate and conduct a filling station, store, rent and repair automobiles, and do such other acts and things as are incident to such a business.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Three Thousand (\$3,000.00) Dollars,

payable in cash

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is thirty (30) of the par value of One Hundred (\$100.00)

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 7th day of May, 1930, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy, the following were elected directors: H. C. Beattie and A. C. Varner

EIGHT: That subsequently there was elected as President H. C. Beattie as Vice-President, A. C. Varner as Secretary, and A. C. Varner as Treasurer.

NINTH: That all requirements of Chapter XXXI, L, Article I, of the Civil Code of South Carolina, 1922, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent. of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in Greenville Piedmont newspaper published in the County of Greenville.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, W. P. Blackwell, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.

WHEREAS, R. F. Upchurch and A. P. Upchurch, Jr., both of Greenville, S. C.

did on the 31st day of May, 1930, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is QUALITY CLEANERS AND DYERS

THIRD: That the principal place of business is GREENVILLE, S. C.
