WHEREAS, John E. Johnston and Ida C. Gaines, both of Greenville, S. C.

did on the 28th day of May, 1920, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is Street Motor Company.

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is buy, sell, trade and exchange, and otherwise deal in automobiles, parts, accessories, repairs and otherwise conduct and operate a general automobile business and maintain a general repair department with it, to do a general merchandise brokerage business, to do a general real estate, stock and bond business; in general, to carry on any other lawful business whatsoever in connection with the foregoing, which is calculated directly or indirectly to promote the interests of the corporation; or to enhance the values of its property, including the buying and selling of property of any and all kinds, and the doing of any other things for profit.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Fifteen Thousand (\$15,000.00)

payable in cash and merchandise.

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is one hundred and fifty (150) of the par value of One Hundred (\$100.00)

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 27 day of May, 1920, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy, the following were elected directors: John E. Johnston and Ida C. Gaines.

EIGHT: That subsequently there was elected as President John E. Johnston, as Vice-President, Ida C. Gaines, as Secretary, Ida C. Gaines, as Treasurer, John E. Johnston.

NINTH: That all requirements of Chapter XXX L Article I, of the Civil Code of South Carolina, 1922 and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with; 50 per cent. of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in Greenville News a newspaper published in the County of Greenville
