EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT.

WHEREAS, W. R. Hale, Jr., and W. R. Hale, both of Greenville, S. C.

did on the 14th day of August, 1920, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is W. R. Hale Land Co.

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is to buy, lease or otherwise acquire lands and erect buildings thereon, with power to transfer same or any part thereof by making good fee simple titles, or by lease, or otherwise. To conduct a general brokerage or commission business, including the buying, selling or renting of real estate, for others, and borrowing money of others and giving security for same. To conduct a general loan business, lending money in any amount, secured by mortgages on real estate or personal property. To act as agents for life or fire insurance companies. To conduct mercantile businesses of any kind. To have the power to do all and everything necessary for the accomplishment of any or all of the objects above enumerated, consistent with the laws and usages of this State. But nothing herein set forth is to be construed to authorize the formation of any insurance or banking corporation or saving bank.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Five thousand (\$5,000.00) Dollars,

payable 50% paid in, with balance payable on call of Directors.

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is One hundred (100) of the par value of Fifty (\$50.00)

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 13th day of August, 1920, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy, the following were elected directors: W. R. Hale, and W. R. Hale, Jr.

EIGHT: That subsequently there was elected as President, and Treasurers, W. R. Hale, as Vice-President, and Secretary, W. R. Hale, Jr., as Treasurer.

NINTH: That all requirements of Chapter 2210, Article 1, of the Civil Code of South Carolina, 1920, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent. of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in The Piedmont newspaper published in the County of Greenville.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, W. P. Blackwell, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Meane Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
