WHEREAS, H. G. Wood, C. L. Craigo, R. L. Prince, B. P. Brenshaw and W. S. Powell, all of Greenville, S. C.

did on the 23rd day of June, 1921, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is Palmetto Bonding Company

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is to act as surety on recognizance and bonds of all kinds, to buy and sell real estate, and act as trustee and guardian, to handle note and mortgages of all kinds.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Ten Thousand (\$10,000.00) Dollars,

payable in cash

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is one hundred of the par value of One Hundred (\$100.00)

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 22nd day of June, 1921, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy, the following were elected directors:

H. G. Wood, C. L. Craigo, R. L. Prince and B. P. Brenshaw

EIGHT: That subsequently there was elected as President, H. G. Wood as Vice-President, R. L. Prince, as Secretary, B. P. Brenshaw as Treasurer, B. P. Brenshaw

NINTH: That all requirements of Chapter 220, Article I, of the Civil Code of South Carolina, 1922, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent. of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in the Greenville News newspaper published in the County of Greenville

NOW, THEREFORE, I, W. P. Blackwell, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Meane Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.

C.
