demanding relief as to the real estate described in the complaint; and the cause being at issue, came on to be heard on the 27th day of May 1927 and such proceedings were had therein as resulted in a decree of the said Court, whereby it was adjudged and decreed that the said real estate hereinafter mentioned and described, be conveyed by E. Henson and his heirs and assigns, all that certain parcel or tract of land situate and being in Highland and O'Neals townships Greenville County, State of South Carolina containing fifty eight (58) acres, more or less, and consisting of the following four adjoining tracts: That tract containing nine and two twenty one hundredths (9 21/100) acres, more or less conveyed by Martha C. Neal and J. B. Neal to W. J. Henson by deed recorded in Vol 23 at page 404. R. M. C. office for Greenville County, and fully described therein; that tract containing eighteen (18) acres, more or less conveyed by W. P. Gibson to W. J. Henson by deed recorded in Vol 41 at page 437. R. M. C. office for Greenville County, and more or less conveyed by W. W. Bruce to W. J. Henson by deed recorded in Vol 41 at page 464. R. M. C. office for Greenville County, and more fully described therein; and that tract containing ten (10) acres, more or less, conveyed to W. J. Henson by deed of J. Tapp recorded in Vol 41 at page 484. R. M. C. office for Greenville County and more fully described therein.
