All that other certain piece, parcel or tract of land situate, lying and being on the Rutledge Road, in O'Neal Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, containing forty-eight and a half acres, one-hundredths (48.1/2) acres, more or less, and having the following courses and dimensions, to wit:

Beginning at a stone near the road, and run thence along the fence line N. 20° 47' E. 1220 feet to a stone, L. A. Lanfords corner, thence with the Lanford line S. 74° 00' E. 450.7 feet to an iron pin, thence with Lanford and Brown line S. 22° 21' 130.5 feet to an iron pin, thence with the Brown line S. 74° 45' E. 396 feet to an iron pin on old road bank, thence S. 7.15 E. 631.5 feet to a bend in old road, thence along this road S. 39.15 E. 637 feet to an iron pin 10' on the bank of another road; thence along this road S. 15.20 E. 421 feet to the intersection of this with still another road, thence along this road S. 76.15 E. 660 feet to its intersection with the old Rutledge Road, thence along this road N. 10.00 E. 1936.5 feet to an iron pin in the center of the road, thence N. 73.45 E. 637 feet to the beginning corner.
