Now, know all men by these presents, that I, Susan Vaughan of the County and State aforesaid, do hereby make, constitute and appoint my good daughter, Agnes Purdette Johnson of Greenville, South Carolina, my true and lawful Attorney-in-fact, for me and in my name, to ask, demand, sue for, recover, and receive of and from the Administrator, or Administrators, of my said deceased brother, all my distributive share of his, my said deceased brother's estate and effects, to which I am entitled as his sister, under the statute for the distribution of the personal estate of intestates; and upon receipt thereof for me, and in my name, to give good and effectual release and discharge to the administrator, or administrators of my said deceased brother, and also for me, and in my name and to my use, to settle and adjust with the said administrator, or administrators, any accounts, agreement or composition in, about, or concerning my said distributive share or other matter or thing in relation thereto. And all and whatsoever my said attorney shall lawfully do or cause to be done in or about the premises I do hereby ratify and confirm.
