Hofford, Guscoe Hofford, and Fleming Hofford, in the State aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of Nine Hundred and 900 Dollars, to us paid by H. H. Hofford, as trustee, in the State aforesaid, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release, unto the said H. H. Hofford, as trustee;

All that certain piece, parcel or tract of land situated, lying and being in Henry Mt. Township, Greenville County, State aforesaid adjoining lands of Mary J. Willbanks and other, and having the following metes and bounds, to wit: Beginning at a stone N. E. Hofford's corner, and running thence N. 1 1/2 E. 16 chs. and 66 links to a small Hickory; thence N. 55 1/2 E. 17 chs. and 75 links to a stone in the branch; thence up the branch to a large poplar; thence N. 13 1/2 E. 12 chs. and 84 links to a stone, J. I. Hofford's corner; thence with his line S 60 1/2 33 chs. and 50 links to a stone at the creek; thence N. 1 1/2 2 chs. and 18 links to a stone, J. I.
