TAX COLLECTOR'S TAX TITLE.

WREREAS, by Acts of the General Assembly of the State of South Carolina, known as Sections 505, 520, 521, and 522 of the Civil Code of South Carolina, 1922, Vol. 5, mand other Acts of the General Assembly, provision is made that within a specified time after the expiration of the time allowed by law for the payment of taxes in any year in the County of Greenville, the County Treasurer of Greenville County shall issue in the name of the State a warrant-or execution against each defaulting taxpayer in his County, directed to the Sheriff, requiring and commending him to levy the same by distress and sale of so much of the taxpayers estate, real or personal, or both, as may be sufficient to satisfy the taxas, State, School, County and Special, of such-defaulters; and ... FURTHER, ... proceed. in the manner prescribed in said statute to enforce the collection of said tax and after due advertisement sell the same before the Court House door of Greenville County as therein provided, and WHEREAS, under and by virtue of an Act of the General Assembly of the State of South Carolina, approved the 10th day of March, 1928, the duty of the Sheriff of Greenville County with reference to the collection of delinquent taxes was conferred upon the delinquent tax collector, who has been duly appointed and qualified by law and is now discharging all of the duties required by said Act; and

WMEREAS, there appears on the Tax Duplicate of Greenville County for the fiscal year commencing January 1st., 1924, certain real estate consisting of three acres of land assessed in the name of J. E. Lawrence and valued at two hundred (200) Dellars, the taxes, penalties and assessments thereon amounting to \$46.89 forty six and 89/100 Dollars; and

WHEREAS; the above named J. E. Lawrence having negoted to pay the County Treasurer of Greenville County the above taxes, assessments and penalties as prescribed by law, an execution was issued therefor as directed by said Acts, on the 18 day of March 1925, and lodged with the Tax Collector of Greenville, County; and,

WHEREAS, at a sale made on the 5 day of November, 1928, as directed by said Acts, by the said Tax Collector, after levy under said execution and the due notice, Mary E. Rector -became the purchaser, and having paid to the said Tax Collector the said amount.

NOW, THEREFORE, I\_ Dan W. Cochran, Jr., as the said Tax Collector of Greenville County, in consideration of the premises, and in further consideration of the sum of three Dollars, good and lawful maney of the United States, to me in hand paid by the said Mary R. Rector, 1 (a receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged) having granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release, unto the said Mary E. Rector, all that certain tract of land in Greenville Township, in the County and State aforesaid,—containing-three-lots,-bounded-by-Beattie-Str.-and-Railroad-Str.-in-the-sectionnear the City Limits of Greenville Known as Richland Creek Hill, being the same property conveyed to J. R. Lawrence by J. L. Hawkins on the 31st day of Jan. 1921 and deed recorded in the R. H. C.
