TO ALL WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME:

I, E. Inman  
Master in and for the County aforesaid, SEND GREETING:

Whereas, J.P. Gilreath

on or about the 30th day of January in the year of  
our Lord nineteen hundred and Thirty-two exhibited his complaint in the  
Court of Common Pleas, for the County aforesaid, against Rosa Lee Hart

demanding relief as to the real estate described in the complaint: and the cause being at issue, came on to be heard on the 8th  
day of February 1932, and such proceedings were had therein as resulted in a decree of the said Court, whereby it was  
adjudged and decreed that the said real estate hereinafter mentioned and described, be conveyed by E. Inman  
Master in and for the County aforesaid, to J.P. Gilreath  
for the purposes mentioned in the said decree, as by reference thereto on file in said Court, will appear; (See Judgment Roll No. E-2720)

NOW, Therefore, Know all Men by these Presents, that I, E. Inman  
Master, in and for the County of Greenville aforesaid, by virtue of the aforesaid decree.

HAVE GRANTED, conveyed and released, and by these presents, DO GRANT, convey and release unto the said J.P. Gilreath

All the right, title and interest of Rosa Lee Hart  
in and to the following described real estate:

"All that piece, parcel or lot of land, lying  
in Greenville County, State aforesaid, on the head  
waters of Enorce Run about one half mile east of  
Enorce Baptist Church, containing fifty-five acres, more  
or less, and being bounded by the lands of J.E. Black on  
the north, W. H. Black on the east, J.P. Gilreath on the  
south and by lands belonging to A. J. Hart estate on the  
west and more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at an iron pin in the New Pine Log Ford  
Road, contiguous to the land of J.P. Gilreath and running  
N. 11<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> E. 10.60 to P. gum; thence due north 10.00 to poplar; thence  
N. 22<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> E. 13.15 to iron pin; thence S. 44<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> E. 21 14.66 to stake; thence  
S. 16 E. 9.70 to stone; thence N. 60<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> W. 13.10 to stake; thence S.  
72<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> E. 23.45 to pine; thence S. 72<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> E. 02 to stake in road;  
thence S. 70 E. 5.20 to post in road; thence S. 65 E. 4.00 to  
stone in head of road; thence N. 62 E. 13.05 to beginning  
point, as appears by reference to the plat made by M.D.  
Owens, Surveyor, Jan'y 2, 1932. The land hereinabove  
described is a part of the land left by A. J. Hart."
