George C. Cole, all the right, title and interest of Richard
Hanby, Madel Hanby and Lou Johnston, in and to the following
described real estate:

"All that piece, parcel or lot of land in Township,
Greenville County, South Carolina, on Parkins Mill Road, about
three miles east of the City of Greenville, adjoining and
bounded by the Old Fair Ground property on the north
and west sides and on the south by the 30 acre tract
formerly belonging to J. A. Adams, and on the East by
the said Parkins Mill Road, containing two acres"
