NOW, Therefore, Know all Men L: these Presents, that I, E. Inman,
Master, in and for the County of Greenville aforesaid, by virtue of the aforesaid decree.

HAVE GRANTED, conveyed and released, and by these presents, DO GRANT, convey and release unto the said
R. F. Watson.

"All that tract of land situated in the County of Greenville, State of South
Carolina, containing 11.68 acres, more or less, and more particularly described as
follows:

Beginning at a point in the center of the National Highway 29, which point is
the joint corner with Lot No. 6 and runs thence along the center of said Highway along
the lines of Lots 6, 7, 1 and 2 to the line of the Gillespie Nursery property, thence
S. 8 E. 12.25 crossing the Southern Railway to an iron pin near a branch; thence S.
85 1/2 W. 6.85 to a white oak; thence N. 71 W. 9.29 crossing Southern Railway to the
beginning corner, and being tract No. 8 as shown on plat recorded in Plat Book I,
pages 27 and 28."

The consideration for the above conveyance is the sum of \$1800.00, which amount
was paid by the grantee to J. L. Locke, as trustee.
