Helen Holliday, Lucetta Holliday, Joe W. Holliday, Fred W. Holliday
and J. W. Holliday in the State aforesaid
in consideration of the sum of Five hundred and One & 72/100

in the State aforesaid, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release, unto the said
Mrs. Ruth Holliday

all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina.

All that certain piece, parcel or tract of land situate,
lying and being in the County and State aforesaid, in
West Dunblin Township, and being a part of the tract of
land conveyed to the said E. M. Holliday by E. H. and P. W.
Ackers in 1804. Said tract hereby conveyed being more
particularly described as follows:

Beginning at a dead post oak near a public road
which road leads from the Princeton Road to the Conley
Bridge Road, and is the joint corner between said lands of
Ruth Holliday and the lands of J. W. Holliday, and running
thence S 11 W 14.00 chains to poplar trees at spring 3 4,
and running thence N 72 1/2 E 14 chains to light wood
stump on E. H. Ackers line, said tract containing 40 acres,
more or less, and being bounded by lands of E. H. Ackers on
the East, lands of J. W. Holliday on the North, lands of E. M.
Holliday on the West, and being the said tract of land
on which the said Mrs. Ruth Holliday and family have
lived and occupied since 1918.
