(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have Granted, Bargained, Sold and Released, and by these presents do Grant, Bargain, Sell and Release unto the said W. M. Chamblee his heirs and assigns:

All that certain, piece, parcel or tract of land, lying, being and situate in the County and State aforesaid and containing Fifty-One and two-fifth acres, more or less with the following metes and bounds, to-wit: Beginning at a stone on the Public Road, known as the old Scuffletown road or the road leading from the Georgia Road to Gilbert Shoals, corner of lands formerly owned by J. J. Gaylord, running thence S. 55½ W. 3.75 to Stone thence S. 25 E. 3.50 to stone; thence S. 41 W. 20.40 along Gaylord line to Stone; thence S. 31 E. 16.25 to White Oak; thence N. 45½ E. 23.80 to Stake at Public Road; thence N. 48½ E. 10.29 to Pine Knot, Y. A. Edwards land; thence N. 53 ¼ W. 13.30 to stake; thence S. 61 W. 4.73 to stake on Public Road; thence along Public Road N. 32 W. 6.35 to stake on Road the beginning corner, and being the same tract of land conveyed to me by deed of Jess W. Foster; said deed bearing date of January 15, 1920, and recorded in the R. M. C. office for Greenville County in Book 66, at page 216. Which is more fully described in a plat made by S. G. Anderson, surveyor dated January 15, 1920.
