(The receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have Granted, Bargained, Sold and Released, and by these presents do Grant, Bargain, Sell and Release unto the said

G. P. Brissey,  
A one-seventh undivided interest in and to all that certain piece, parcel or lot of land situate, lying and being on Trade Street in the Town of Greer, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, being known and designated as Lot No. Nine upon a plat made by W. L. Neece of the Public Square of the Town of Greer, said plat being recorded in Plat Book E at Page 10, R. M. C. office for Greenville County, and being the same lot of land conveyed to J. J. Miller by deed of the Town of Greer as recorded in said County in Deed Book 33 at Page 248.

Also, a one-seventh undivided interest in and to all that certain piece, parcel or tract of land containing Twenty and one half (20½) acres, more or less, situate, lying and being near the Town of Greer, in Beech Springs Township, Spartanburg County, State of South Carolina, and bounded by the lands of Tom Landmon, W. A. Dempsey, W. L. Bailew and others, and being known as the Home Place of J. J. Miller, deceased, and lying on the north side of the Beech Springs Apalache road between Greer and Apalache Mill.

Also, a one-seventh undivided interest in and to a certain group of lots situate, lying and being near the Town of Greer, in Beech Springs Township, Spartanburg County, State of South Carolina, known and designated as Lots Nos. 1, 2 and 3 in Block H, on a plat of land known as "Dillworth Park", according to survey of Jerry Respass, December 14, 1916, and lots Nos. 8, 9 and 11 in Block D on a plat of land known as "Dillworth Park", and recorded in the office of R. M. C. for Spartanburg County, in Plat Book 5, at page 63, and being the same property in which J. J. Miller, deceased, purchased an undivided one-half interest in lots 8, 9 and 11, and a one-seventh undivided interest in lots nos. 1, 2 and 3, as above described, by deed of Bobo Burnett, Justice, dated April 21st 1926. The interest conveyed herein by the grantor herein, in the real estate in this paragraph of this deed, is that interest which the grantor herein acquired by virtue of being an heir-at-law of J. J. Miller, deceased.

The above described land is the same inherited by me from J. J. Miller, deceased.
