THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is manufacturing, buying, selling and dealing in pants, overalls, riding breeches, men's wash suits, and other articles of clothing, and general manufacturing and mercantile business.

payable in cash, property or its equivalent; The sum of \$500.00 having been subscribed and paid in cash or property.

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is Ten (10)

of the par value of One Hundred (\$100.00)

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 11th day of July, 1933, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy the following were elected directors:

L. B. Sims and Mrs. J. R. Ray,

EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected as President L. B. Sims,

as Vice-President, Mrs. J. R. Ray, as Secretary, Mrs. J. R. Ray

as Treasurer, L. B. Sims.

NINTH: That all requirements of Chapter 153 Article 2 Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1932 and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent. of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in The Piedmont

a newspaper published in the County of Greenville

NOW, THEREFORE, I, W. P. Blackwell, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
