

The State of South Carolina, BY THE SECRETARY OF THE STATE.

EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT

WHEREAS, Hopson L. Biggs, Lydia B. Biggs, and Edna B. Graves, all of Greenville, S. C

Did on the 2th day of December, 1933 file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is E. W. Biggs Mortuary

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is Undertaking, funeral and mortuary,

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Thirty-five Hundred (\$3,500.00)

payable in cash. Dollars,

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is thirty-five (35) of the par value of One Hundred (\$100.00)

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 6th day of December 1933, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy the following were elected directors: Hopson L. Biggs, Lydia B. Biggs, and Edna B. Graves.

EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected as President Hopson L. Biggs, as Vice-President, Lydia B. Biggs, as Secretary, Edna B. Graves, as Treasurer, Lydia B. Biggs,

NINTH: That all requirements of Chapter 1153 Article 2 of the Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1932 and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, to-wit: ten per cent, of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in The Greenville News, a newspaper published in the County of Greenville

NOW, THEREFORE, I, W. P. Blackwell, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
