It is Ordered, Adjudged and Decreed that the plaintiff and defendant herein forthwith live separate and apart each from the other and that both parties be relieved of any responsibility either to the other in the future.

It is Further Ordered, Adjudged and Decreed that neither party hereto shall by reason of dower, inheritance, curtesy, or otherwise have any right, claim or interest whatever in any property of the other which either may now or hereafter possess or become entitled to.
