## TITLE TO REAL ESTATE

STATE OF SOUTH CAROLINA,

Greenville County.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That I, Mary J. Bates,

In the State aforesaid, County of Greenville,  
Four Hundred and fifty no/100  
In consideration of the sum of \_\_\_\_\_ Dollars,

to, me, Estelle McIntyre

In the State aforesaid, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Estelle McIntyre

all that place, parcel or lot of land in Greenville Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, near the City limits of the City of Greenville, known as lot No. 2, on plat of property of Mary J. Bates made by W. J. Riddle, July 27th, 1834, and having the following metes and bounds, according to said plat:

Beginning at an iron pin in center of ten foot alley between property of grantor and James C. Bates, and running thence with center of said alley N. 64-30 E. 61 feet to corner of lot No. 1; thence with said line of lot S. 28 E. 60 feet to iron pin; thence S. 35-30 W. 61.5 feet to iron pin corner lot No. 3; thence with line of said lot N. 28 W. 68.5 feet to beginning corner.

This conveyance is made subject to the right of James C. Bates to use said 10 foot alley for the purpose of ingress and egress to and from his lot lying on the north side of the lot hereinabove conveyed, said alley extending from Austin Street a distance of 180 feet along the north side of the lot conveyed to Mary J. Bates by James C. Bates by his deed dated Nov. 7, 1831, recorded in R. M. C. O. for said County in Deed Book 75 page 48; and also to the right of Mary J. Bates, her heirs and assigns, to use said alley for the benefit of lots Nos. 1 and 3 on said plat.

The above described land in a portion of the same conveyed to me by James C. Bates  
on the 7th day of November 1831, deed recorded in office of Register of Deeds Conveyance for Greenville County, in Book 75 page 48.

TOGETHER with all and singular the rights, franchises, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in anywise incident or appertaining.

TO NAME AND NO. MILE, all and singular, the premises before mentioned unto the said Estelle McIntyre, her heirs and assigns forever.

AND, I, myself and my heirs, executors and administrators to warrant and defend all and singular the said premises unto the said Estelle McIntyre, her heirs and assigns, against all and every lawfully claiming, or to claim, the same, or any part thereof.
