All that certain place, parcel or tract of land, lying, situate and being in the County of Greenville, State of South Carolina, in O'Neal Township, containing 160 acres, and having the following lines and bounds and courses and distances, according to a Survey made by W. A. Foster, Surveyor, June, 1933.

Beginning at an iron pin in the Tigerville Road at corner of other lands of Mrs. W. L. Plumbles and running thence N. $74\frac{1}{2}$ E. 17.80 chains to bend in road; thence N. $89\frac{1}{2}$ E. 6.80 chains to bend in road; thence N. $78\frac{1}{2}$ E. 8.80 chains to iron pin; thence due South 46.80 chains to iron pin on south side of Beaver Dam Creek; thence S. $57\frac{1}{2}$ E. 2 chains to wild cherry on south side of said creek; thence S. 18 W. 12.81 chains to Spanish Oak stump; thence N. $60\frac{1}{2}$ W. 13.27 chains to stone H. A. Taylor's corner; thence N. $9\frac{1}{2}$ W. 29.70 chains to stone in Beaver Dam Creek; thence up the meanders of said creek 26.83 chains to a stake in creek; thence N. $56\frac{1}{2}$ W. 6.78 chains to center of State highway; thence N. 35 E. with road 4.17 chains to a point in road; thence N. $21\frac{1}{2}$ W. 8 chains to iron pin; thence N. 15 E.

14.60 chains to a Poplar tree; thence N. $61\frac{1}{2}$ E. 3.55 chains to iron pin; thence S. $64\frac{1}{2}$ E. 8 chains to stone; thence S. $51\frac{1}{2}$ E. 8.50 chains to the beginning corner. Being a portion of the tract of land conveyed to J. J. Noble by C. W. Mitchell by deed recorded in the R.M.C. Office for Greenville County in Deed Book 5, at page 779. The said J. J. Noble having died intestate September 4, 1922, leaving as his only heirs at law his widow Lura Noble (now Lura Cooper and a daughter Mrs. W. L. Plumbles, and the interest of the said Lura Cooper having subsequently been conveyed to Mrs. W. L. Plumbles by deed dated September 12, 1931, recorded in the P. C. Office for Greenville County in Deed Book 93, at page 291.
