

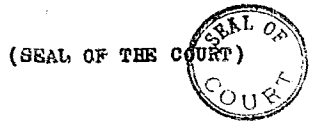

At Greenville, S. C., in said District, on the 25 day of January, A. D. 1933, before the Honorable H. H. Watkins, Judge of said Court in Bankruptcy, the petition of Louis Winter, Trading as Manchester Hat Company; Curlee Clothing Company, a corp; and Richmond Hosiery Mills, a corp., trading as Arrowhead Hosiery Mills, that Morris Gorman, Greenville, S. C.---Greenville County -- be adjudged a bankrupt, within the true intent and meaning of the act of Congress relating to bankruptcy, having been heard and duly considered, the said Morris Gorman is hereby declared and adjudged a bankrupt accordingly.

It is therefore ordered, That upon the petition filed in this Court against said bankrupt on the 3 day of January A. D. 1933 said matter be referred to E. M. Blythe, Esq., Greenville, S. C. one of the Referees in Bankruptcy of this Court, to take such further proceedings therein as are required by said Acts; and that the said Morris Gorman shall attend before said Referee on the 8 day of February, 1933, at 11 o'clock in the forenoon and thenceforth shall submit to such orders as may be made by said Referee or by this Court relating to said Involuntary bankruptcy.
