said galvanized seed house and gin, running over and across the above described premises to a point on or near the said railway spur track on said premises, including any standards, supports and appliances constituting a part of said pipe or used in connection therewith.

Also, all right, title, interest and claim of Fountain Inn Oil Mill & Fertilizer Company in and to that section or portion of a brick warehouse located upon the railway siding and upon the right of way of the Charleston & Western Carolina Railway Company, in the town of Simpsonville, and lying immediately south of and adjacent to that three room brick warehouse formerly the property of Fountain Inn Oil Mill and Fertilizer Company, now property of the Buckeye Cotton Oil Company, including all rights of way, platform and appurtenances adjoining said section of brick warehouse and used in connection therewith, together with all right, title, interest and claim of Fountain Inn Oil Mill & Fertilizer Company in and to that overhead seed pipe leading from the gin house immediately across the street intersection between said section of brick warehouse and gin, to and through said portion or section of said warehouse.
