and all premises me paid to Joseph C. Harrell and Vardell Fraser Harrell

in the State aforesaid, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release, unto the said Joseph C. Harrell and Vardell Fraser Harrell

My home place on the Sandh Flat road, about three miles northwest of Greer, S. C. which is situated my dwelling house in which I now live, & where I have lived since the year 1910, consisting of about twenty acres, being a part of the original tract of about thirty-one acres deeded to me by Tom A. Mayfield described as follows:

All that certain piece, parcel or tract of land situated lying and being in the County of Greenville in the State aforesaid on both sides of the Buncombe road adjoining lands of J. F. Westmoreland, R. L. Ford and Mr. Bird, and hath the following measure:

Beginning at a stake, new corner, and running and remaining thence S. 26. E. 24.07 chs. to a stone, thence S. 65 1/2 E. 10.33 chs. to stake at the branch, thence N. 17. W. 1.36 chs. to stake in gully, thence N. 48. E. 15.46 chs. to a stone, block or b gone, thence N. 56 1/2 E. 6.00 chs. to a stake, new corner, thence N. 55. E. 19.62 chs. to the beginning corner, containing thirty-one and 85/100 acres, more or less.
