All that tract of land in Glassy Mountain Township Greenville County State of South Carolina beginning on the north side of Glassy Mountain road on west line and running thence S. 72° 18.86 to stone; thence N. 76° E. 11.15 to Poplar; thence N. 11.17 E. 11.25 to stone; thence N. 9 E. 5.76 to Persimmon; thence N. 88 1/4 E. 1.85 to stake; thence North 55 1/4 18.54 to a stake; thence S. 30 1/2 W. 16.10 to stake on East side of road; thence N. 82 3/4 W. 14.4 to a stake in the old road; thence S. 72° 5.45 to the beginning, containing 31 acres, more or less, and known as the M. P. Barnett land, less 6.97 acres sold by G. S. West to J. P. Stewart, as shown by Deed Book 106 page 106.

Also, all the tract of land in Greenville County South Carolina, Glassy Mt. Township containing 48 acres more or less and bounded by lands now or formerly owned by Joshua Lindsey, R. C. Evaris, E. S. West and others, and known as the J. D. Reed place, lying on the road leading to the J. H. Hosnell place, and having such courses and distances as will appear in Mort Book 38 page 75 R. M. C.
