WHEREAS, B. H. Laughridge, Lancaster, S.C., Joe Rigdon and A. S. Locke, of Greenville, S.C.

did on the 27th day of August, 1934, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is Greenville Brick and Tile Company

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S.C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is manufacture dunstone brick and tiling

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Four Thousand Five Hundred Dollars, (\$ 4,500.00) payable in cash

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is ninety (90) of the par value of Fifty (\$ 50.00)

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 15th day of April, 1934, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy the following were elected directors: B. H. Laughridge, J. W. Belk, B. W. Quinn, John Miller, and Solus McCreary

EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected as President Joe Rigdon as Vice-President, A. S. Locke; as Secretary, Arthur Miller as Treasurer, Arthur Miller

NINTH: That all requirements of Article 2, Chapter 153 Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1932, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent, of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent, of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in Greenville News

a newspaper published in the County of Greenville NOW, THEREFORE, I, W. P. Blackwell, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
