WHEREAS, S. M. Joy and Rilia M. Lain, both of Greenville, S.C.

did on the 21st day of January, 1935, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is Southern Amusement Company of Greenville, S.C.

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Airport Hangar, Greenville, S.C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is to purchase, own, produce, and to license others to produce and present plays, exhibitions of various kinds, including walkathons and other forms of amusement except carnivals and traveling shows under tents; to lease, purchase and sell and mortgage theatres and other amusement plays of all kinds and descriptions; to handle concessions of all kinds not prohibited and to do any and all things necessary in the conduct of said business not prohibited by law

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is One thousand (\$1,000.00) Dollars, payable in cash.

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is Ten (10) of the par value of One Hundred (\$100.00)

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 19th day of January, 1935, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy the following were elected directors: S. M. Joy and Rilia M. Lain

EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected as President S. M. Joy as Vice-President, Rilia M. Lain; as Secretary, Rilia M. Lain as Treasurer, S. M. Joy

NINTH: That all requirements of Article 2, Chapter 153 Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1932, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent, of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in The Greenville News a newspaper published in the County of Greenville

NOW, THEREFORE, I, W. P. Blackwell, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
