I, E. INMAN, Master in and for the County aforesaid, SEND GREETINGS:

WHEREAS, J. K. Earle, Agent,

came about the 26th day of June in the year of
our Lord nineteen hundred and thirty exhibited 115 complaint in the Court of
Common Pleas, for the County aforesaid, against Israel Saul, et al.

According to judgment in relation to the real estate hereinafter mentioned and described; and the cause being at issue, came on to be heard on the 18th
day of November in 32 and such proceedings were had therein as resulted in a Decree

of the said Court, whereby it was adjudged and decreed that the said real estate hereinafter mentioned and described be sold by E. INMAN, Master in and for the County aforesaid, on the terms and for the purposes mentioned in the said decree, as by reference thereto on file in said Court will appear; and the Master, after having duly advertised the said real estate

dispose of the same unto Louise Earle and India Earle Pepper

for the sum of Twenty-Five Hundred (\$2500.00) Dollars,
being at that price the highest bidder therefor.

NOW, THEREFORE, Know All Men by These Presents, That I, E. INMAN, Master in and for the County of Greenville, aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of
Twenty-Five Hundred (\$2500.00) Dollars
to me paid by the said Louise Earle and India Earle Pepper

the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, HAVE GRANTED, bargained, sold, and released, and by these Presents DO GRANT, bargain, sell and release unto the said
Louise Earle and India Earle Pepper

"All that tract or parcel of land, situate in the County and State aforesaid, in Greenville Township; on the west side of the Old White Horse Road, and having the following courses and distances, according to plat made by R. E. Dalton, Engineer, in July 1922, and recorded in the office of R. M. C. for said County in Plat Book F, Pages 77, 79, and 81, said being known as Lot No. 92 on said plat;

Beginning at a stake in the center of the Wilbanks Street, at the intersection of the White Horse Road, and running thence with the center of Wilbanks Street, S. 79-45 W. 1137.3 feet to stake at the intersection of Wilbanks Street and Curtis road; thence with the center of Curtis Road S. 52-10 E. 100 feet to bend; thence S. 37-50 E. 199.5 feet to a bend; thence S. 26-20 E. 125 feet to bend; thence S. 19-35 E. 368 feet to stake in center of public road; thence with public road N. 87 E. 151 feet to stake, thence N. 22-15 E. 55.3 feet to stake in branch; thence the branch the line, N. 79 E. 71.8 feet; thence N. 89-10 E. 100 feet; thence N. 81-20 E. 200 feet; leaving the branch to stake in center of Old White Horse Road; thence with said White Horse Road the following courses and distances: N. 10-50 E. 108.4 feet; thence N. 26-26 E. 200 feet; thence N. 13-50 E. 400 feet; thence N. 0-13 W. 100 feet to the beginning, containing 13.60 acres, more or less."
