TO ALL WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME:

I, E. INMAN, Master in and for the County aforesaid, SEND GREETINGS:

WHEREAS, Wilton T. Hudson,

on or about the 31st day of May in the year of our Lord nineteen hundred and thirty five exhibited his complaint in the Court of Common Pleas for the County aforesaid, against W. H. Burrell, et al

demanding judgment in relation to the real estate hereinafter mentioned and described; and the cause being at issue, came on to be heard on the 6th day of December, 1935, and such proceedings were had therein as resulted in a Decree

of the said Court, whereby it was adjudged and decreed that the said real estate hereinafter mentioned and described be sold by E. INMAN, Master in and for the County aforesaid, on the terms and for the purposes mentioned in the said decree, as by reference thereto on file in said Court will appear; and the Master, after having duly advertised the said real estate

for sale by public outcry on the 6th day of January in the year of our Lord nineteen hundred and thirty six, did then openly and publicly, according to the custom of auctions, sell and dispose of the same unto Wilton T. Hudson

for the sum of Fifty (\$50.00) Dollars, being at that price the highest bidder therefor.

NOW, THEREFORE, Know All Men by These Presents, That I, E. INMAN, Master in and for the County of Greenville aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of Fifty (\$50.00) Dollars to me paid by the said Wilton T. Hudson

the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, HAVE GRANTED, bargained, sold, and released, and by these Presents DO GRANT, bargain, sell and release unto the said Wilton T. Hudson

"All those five certain pieces, parcels or tracts of land situate, lying and being in the State of South Carolina, and County of Greenville, in O'Neal Township, on the waters of South Tyger River, about two miles from Sandy Flat, near the road from Sandy Flat to Fowler's store, on both sides of Long Branch, containing in the aggregate thirty-eight (38) acres, more or less, adjoining lands now or formerly belonging to Mrs. Rebecca Bramlett, Wisely Curry, J. L. Westmoreland, Mrs. T. W. Stroup and others; the lands herein conveyed lying on the Mays Bridge Road and having such metes and bounds as are set forth in the Complaint herein and in the mortgage given by W. H. Burrell to C. A. Fowler, bearing date May 12, 1919, and recorded in the office of the R. M. C. for said County in Book 75, at page 144."
