on the West side of Calhoun Street in the City of Greenville and known and designated as Lot No. 32 as shown on plat recorded in R. M. C. Office for Greenville County in Plat Book WW at page 605 and having the following metes and bounds: to-wit:

Beginning at a stake on Calhoun Street 86 feet from the northwest corner of Calhoun and Dunbar Street and running thence with the line of Lot No. 33, N. 76 W. 200 feet to a 10-foot alley; thence with said alley, N. 18 E. 43 feet; thence S. 76 E. 200 feet to Calhoun Street; thence with Calhoun Street, S. 18 W. 43 feet to the beginning corner. Being the same lot of land conveyed to John Tribble and Nora C. Tribble by Eva C. Fitchett by deed dated September 21, 1923 and recorded in the R. M. C.
