That deponent is a practicing attorney at the Greenville Bar: that deponent was well acquainted with Mary J. Logan, who died in the year 1910, leaving her will which is now on file in Apartment 99, file 18, probate office of Greenville County; that deponent knew her three daughters, Martha Webb Logan who married Arthur L. Ewbank and was afterwards known as Martha L. Ewbank, Annie Legare Logan who married a Caldwell and was thereafter known as Annie L.
